SHOW DETAILS

This 2-day Horse Driving Trial (or HDT) is sanctioned by the Alberta Equestrian Federation (AEF) as a Wild Rose Competition. Each day will be treated as a separate show and will include all 3 phases of competition: Dressage, Cones and Marathon. The event will be run under the 2017 American Driving Society (ADS) rules unless otherwise stated. The ADS Rulebook is available online at www.americandrivingsociety.org. ALL competitors **must** provide proof of membership with their Provincial Sports Association (Alberta Equestrian Federation or provincial equivalent).

Entries are limited and accepted on a first paid basis (must be post-marked on/before July 24, 2017). Late entries may be accepted, if space permits, and will be subject to a \$25 late fee. Entry fees are only refundable subject to a Veterinarian's or Doctor's certificate prior to the start of the show.

ACDA Member: \$175 weekend or \$125 day
Non-Member: \$200 weekend or \$150 day

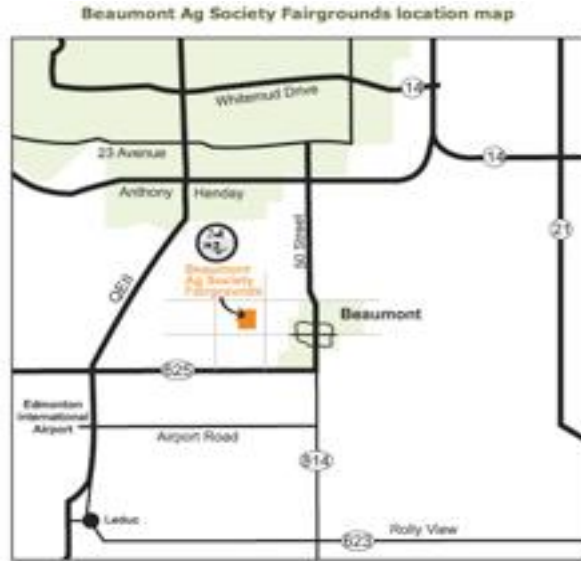
As a sanctioned "Wild Rose Competition" all eligible entries received prior to the entry deadline will be entered into the AEF's "Win Your Entry" program which award one competitor (selected by random draw) with a refund of their entry fee (to a maximum of \$150).

LOGISTICS

Show will be held at the Beaumont & District Agricultural Society Grounds (approx. 2km West of town on 50th Ave). GPS Locate-Leduc County-24358-TWP Rd 505



Dogs: WELL-BEHAVED and QUIET dogs are welcome provided they are under the direct control of the owner, either leashed, caged or confined to your trailer. Unattended loose dogs are a safety risk and will not be tolerated.

Food: A concession will be available on site Saturday & Sunday. There are also several fast food/restaurants available minutes away in the town of Beaumont.

Saturday Supper: The Klondike Chapter will host a Supper & Social on Saturday evening at 6pm. Dinner tickets must be pre-purchased through the show secretary and are \$20/person.

SHOW OFFICE

Office opens Friday evening from 5:00 pm to 8:00 pm and Saturday from 7:30am to 9:00 a.m. Competitors & Grooms must report to the show office upon arrival to pick up their Competitor's Package and to sign the respective waivers.

PRIZES

Ribbons will be awarded daily for 1st, 2nd & 3rd places in each Class. Classes may be combined dependent on numbers of entries for each class. Prizes also to be awarded for Best Dressage, Best Cones and "Best Marathon". There will be a High Point award for the top aggregate (over both days) score in each Division and a Best Junior.

DIVISIONS

TRAINING LEVEL: Open to novice drivers and drivers with horses that have not competed at higher levels. This level is recommended for competitors beginning Combined Driving competition or for seasoned competitors driving inexperienced horses. Marathon obstacles will not be timed.

PRELIMINARY LEVEL: This level is suitable for beginning competitors with some prior competition experience, such as training level, driving trials, mini-CDE's, etc. Marathon obstacles will be timed

INTERMEDIATE LEVEL: This level is for competitors who have successfully completed at least 3 Combined Driving events at Preliminary Level or higher.

Camping: Dry Camping available on site (no hook-ups) at no cost. Outdoor bathrooms are available (no showers). Hotel and Motel accommodations are available in Nisku and Leduc.

Stabling: Covered boxstalls are available for \$25/night (bedding NOT included). The Show Committee would like to encourage the use of these stalls for the safety and comfort of everyone on the show grounds. One horse/pony permitted per stall, except VSE's which may house no more than 2 familiar animals together in a single stall.

Self-stabling via panels or electric fence will be permitted in a designated area at no cost.

Shavings are available for pre-purchase (*must be pre-ordered on your entry form*) for \$5/bag. Water is available onsite.

CLASSES

Measurements below are for an un-shod equine unless stated otherwise

Horse: any equine over 148cm without shoes or 149cm with shoes

Pony: any equine 120cm to 148cm without shoes or 149cm with shoes

Small Pony: any equine 99cm to less than 120cm with or without shoes

Very Small Equine (VSE): any equine under 99cm

DRESSAGE

TRAINING LEVEL (singles & pairs): **ADS Training Test #3**

PRELIMINARY LEVEL (singles & pairs): **ADS Preliminary Test #1**

PRELIMINARY LEVEL (multiples): **ADS Preliminary Test #5**

INTERMEDIATE LEVEL: **ADS Intermediate Test #2**

Dressage tests can be obtained from www.americandrivingsociety.org. Please note: Training level drivers **are not** permitted to have their tests dictated to them (as per ADS Rulebook Article 945.2).

Presentation will be judged “on the move” and will reflect cleanliness, style of dress and appearance. Jackets or national dress, driving aprons, hats/properly secured and gloves are obligatory for Athletes. For Lady drivers a jacket is optional. Approved protective headgear is recommended. A whip in hand is required.

The Dressage Arena size will be as follows:

CONES/OBSTACLES

Cones will be run as a Fault Competition. Length of the course will be a maximum of 800m. Dress code will be as for Dressage. Speeds and clearances will be in accordance with the 2017 ADS Rule Book.

MARATHON (Section B only)

Total marathon distance will be no more than 10km with up to 5 obstacles.

Marathon must be completed at the walk or trot, except for Intermediate Level which may use any gait. Competitors may walk or trot during the last 300m of the course, with no deviation from course (including circling, serpentine, zigzag or halt for any reason). There may be a water obstacle with a dry route option for training. Use of breeching is mandatory for singles and those vehicles that have no brakes.

Dress code: any style accepted, gloves recommended. Drivers are required to carry a whip in hand at all times while on the marathon course. **Approved PROTECTIVE HEADGEAR is mandatory for ALL participants (including grooms/navigationers) during the Marathon Competition.**

Training Level will complete 3 gates (A, B & C), are permitted to walk/trot anywhere on course. Obstacles will be timed but times will not be posted. Training level competitors are NOT permitted to canter within the obstacles.

Preliminary Level will complete 4 gates (A, B, C & D) and are permitted to canter within an obstacle. Obstacles will be timed with times posted. When on course competitors may only walk or trot.

Intermediate Level will complete 5 gates (A, B, C, D & E) within an obstacle. Obstacles will be timed with times posted. Competitors may walk, trot or canter while on course or in an obstacle but must **walk or trot** the last 300m of the course.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

◆ This Competition will be run under American Driving Society (ADS) Rules unless otherwise stated below. For a complete listing of rules and regulations governing this competition, please read the 2017 American Driving Society Rulebook which is available for free download on the ADS website at www.americandrivingsociety.org/ADS_Rulebook.asp

◆ The Alberta Carriage Driving Association, Klondike Chapter, Beaumont Agricultural Society, the officials, volunteers and all landowners on whose property the competition will take place, and any affiliates will not be held responsible for any theft, accident damage, injury, illness or death of horse, owners, driver, grooms, ground personnel, spectators or any person on the properties whatsoever.

◆ The Alberta Carriage Driving Association (ACDA) Safety Rules will be in effect. These safety rules are available on the ACDA website at albertadriv-ing-acda.ca and a copy will be posted at the show office.

◆ A certified First Aid Attendant will be available onsite during the competition. Local paramedic and Veterinary personnel may not be directly onsite but will be available on an on-call basis (contact information will be posted).

◆ The organizing committee has the right to limit entries, combine classes or refuse any entry. Some competitors may have participated in organizing this event and/or course construction.

◆ Any equine 4 years old or over is eligible to compete

◆ Well-behaved, experienced driving Stallions will be permitted at the discretion of the Organizing Committee. Stallions must be stabled in the covered boxstalls and must be attended to by their driver and/or groom at all times when out of the stall.

◆ Carts/Carriages: any safe vehicle is acceptable. Reflectors and slow moving vehicle sign is not required unless driving on a public road. Pneumatic tires are acceptable in **Training Level only** as long as they are on a solid, sturdy wheel (bicycle-type wheels with thin metal spokes are not permitted due to safety issues). Solid smooth rubber wheels are **required** for all levels other than Training. A spares kit **must be** included on the carriage at all times and may be checked by the Safety Officer.

◆ JUNIORS: Junior Competitors will be 18 years of age & under. Junior Competitors under 14 years of age must be accompanied in the carriage at all times by a groom who is an experienced, adult horse-person. Junior Grooms must be at least 12yrs of age in Training & Preliminary, minimum 14yrs of age for Intermediate Level and must be capable of rendering assistance to the driver. At all times, while on a carriage, Athletes and Grooms under the age of 18 must wear a body protector and a securely fastened Protective Headgear. (see ADS Article 928.3).

◆ All competitors, with exception of Single VSEs and Small Ponies (<120cm) must be accompanied by a groom/navigator during the marathon competition. All multiple hitches (pairs, 4in hands, etc) must be accompanied by a groom(s) in all competitions (see ADS Article 937/943 for groom requirements).

◆Please arrange to have a groom/navigator prior to the show and alert the show office secretary if scheduling issues may arise (Ex: drivers grooming for another driver or a groom attending multiple drivers). Drivers/grooms may act as groom/navigators for other competitors if the schedule allows (please note desire to do so on entry form)

◆ASTM/SEI Approved Helmets MUST be worn by all persons on a vehicle during the Marathon competition. Junior Competitors are required to wear a helmet and body protector at all times while on a carriage or horse.

◆It is strongly recommended that all competitors and grooms wear a Medical Armband containing a list of your personal medical conditions and requirements. Information contained therein is for use by EMT and medical personnel in case of an accident.

◆All competitors will be charged a \$20 Clean-up Deposit (payable by separate cheque). Deposits will be refunded upon confirmation that stall (if used) has been stripped and all manure/garbage has been removed from their parking/stall area and that they have returned their Competitor Numbers to the Show Office.

◆Any questions or complaints should be directed to the Technical Delegate.
