### **SHOW OVERVIEW**

This 2-day Continuous Drive will include two rounds on Saturday and a third round on Sunday. Each round of the continuous drive will consist of a Dressage test, followed by cones and a derby style course. The event will be run under the 2024 American Driving Society (ADS) rules unless otherwise stated. ALL participants <u>must be current members</u> of their Provincial Sports Association (Alberta Equestrian Federation or provincial equivalent).



#### **LOGISTICS**

The Harvest Moon Event will be held at the Brown's farm at 58218 Range Road 260, Vimy, AB.

**Camping:** Dry Camping is available on site (no hook-ups) at no cost. Outdoor bathrooms are available (no showers). Accommodations are available in Westlock. Self-stabling via panels or electric fence will be permitted in a designated area at no cost.

**Dogs:** WELL-BEHAVED and QUIET dogs are welcome provided they are under the direct control of the owner, either leashed, caged or confined to your trailer. Unattended loose dogs are a safety risk and will not be tolerated.



**Food:** There will be no concession on location. Participants must be self-contained and arrange for their own meals, refreshments etc. Saturday evening, we encourage everyone to bring their meal to the central meeting building where we can all share some time together.

**Entertainment:** The Klondike Chapter will host campfire socials on Friday and Saturday evenings.

### **DIVISIONS**

**PRE-TRAINING LEVEL: \*NEW for 2024\*** Open to novice drivers. This level is recommended for competitors beginning Combined Driving competition. Competitors may have a coach or reader during their dressage tests (to be provided by the competitor) and may have their coach assist during cones and the derby portion via a headset (to be provided by the competitor). Derby obstacles will be timed for all levels.

**TRAINING LEVEL:** Open to novice drivers and drivers with horses that have not competed at higher levels. This level is recommended for competitors beginning Combined Driving competition or for seasoned competitors driving inexperienced horses. Derby obstacles will be timed for all levels.

**PRELIMINARY LEVEL:** This level is suitable for beginning competitors with some prior competition experience, such as training level, driving trials mini-CDEs, etc.

**INTERMEDIATE LEVEL:** This level is for competitors who have successfully completed at least 3 Combined Driving events at Preliminary Level or higher.

#### **CLASSES**

Horse: any equine over 148 cm without shoes or 149 cm with shoes

**Pony:** any equine 120 cm to 148 cm without shoes or 149 cm with shoes **Small Pony:** any equine 99 cm to less than 120 cm with or without shoes **Very Small Equine (VSE):** any equine under 99 cm with or without shoes

#### **PRIZES**

Ribbons will be awarded from 1<sup>st</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> place in each Division. Prizes will be awarded to 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Prizes or ribbons will also be awarded for Best Junior, Best Dressage, Best Cones and Best Derby Time for all levels.

## **GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION**

- Should the government have COVID restrictions in place that impact the competition, participants will be notified by the Organizing Committee.
- This competition will be run under American Driving Society (ADS) Rules unless otherwise stated below. For a complete listing of rules and regulations governing this competition, please download the 2024 ADS Rulebook at www.americandrivingsociety.org
- ◆ The Alberta Carriage Driving Association, Klondike Chapter, the officials, volunteers and all landowners on whose property the competition will take place, and any affiliates will not be held responsible for any theft, accident damage, injury, illness or death of horse, owners, driver, grooms, ground personnel, spectators or any person on the properties whatsoever.
- ♦ The landowners and Klondike Chapter require all volunteers, competitors, grooms and any persons riding upon a carriage to sign the landowner's waiver document and wear protective headgear.
- ◆ The Alberta Carriage Driving Association (ACDA) Safety Rules will be in effect. These are available on the ACDA website at <u>albertadriving-acda.ca</u> and will be posted at the show office.
- ◆ A certified First Aider will be available onsite during the competition. Local paramedic and veterinary personnel will be available on an on-call basis (contact information will be posted).
- ◆ The Organizing Committee has the right to limit entries, combine classes or refuse any entry. Some competitors may have participated in organizing this event and/or course construction.
- ◆ Any equine 3 years old or over is eligible to compete.
- Well-behaved, experienced driving stallions will be permitted at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.
- Carts/Carriages: Any safe vehicle is acceptable. Reflectors and slow-moving vehicle signs are not required unless driving on a public road. Solid or Pneumatic tires are acceptable for all levels. Wheels can be wire spoke styled for Training Level only but must be designed for carriages. A spares kit is recommended to be included on the carriage at all times.
- ◆ JUNIORS: Junior Competitors are 18 years of age & under. Junior Competitors under 14 years of age must be accompanied in the carriage at all times by a groom who is an experienced, adult horseperson. Junior Grooms must be at least 12 years of age in Training & Preliminary, minimum 14 years of age for Intermediate Level and must be capable of rendering assistance to the driver. At all times while on a carriage, Junior (Competitors and Grooms) must wear a body/back protector and a securely fastened Protective Headgear (see ADS Article 928.2).
- ◆ All competitors (with the exception of Single VSEs and Small Ponies <120cm) must be accompanied by a groom/navigator during the Derby competition. All multiple hitches (pairs, 4in hands, etc.) must be accompanied by a groom(s) in all competitions (see ADS Rules Article 937.3/943.2.16 for groom requirements). Please arrange to have a groom/navigator prior to the show and alert the show office secretary if scheduling issues may arise (e.g. drivers grooming for another driver or a groom attending multiple drivers). Driv-

ers/grooms may act as groom/navigators for other competitors if the schedule allows (note this on the entry form).

- ♦ ASTM/SEI approved Protective Headgear and a body/back protector MUST be worn by all persons on a vehicle during the Derby competition.
- ◆ It is strongly recommended that all competitors and grooms wear a medical armband containing a list of personal medical conditions and requirements. This information is for use by medical personnel in case of an accident.
- Family members of the officials may be competing in this event.
- ◆ Any questions or complaints should be directed to the Technical Delegate. Questions/concerns will be addressed in consultation with the organizing committee.

## **DRESSAGE**

#### **Tests**

Dressage tests can be obtained from www.americandrivingsociety.org. Please note: Training level drivers <u>are</u> <u>not</u> permitted to have their tests dictated to them (as per ADS Rulebook Article 945.2).

Dress code is casual; protective headgear, and gloves are obligatory for Competitors. Presentation is not judged but a score of 8 will be entered for all competitors. A whip in hand is required.

The Dressage Arena size will be 40x80m for all competitors, unless a significant amount of VSE entries are received. If this is the case, event organizers will consider the addition of a 30x60m dressage ring for the VSEs.

# **CONES/OBSTACLES**

Cones will be run as a Fault Competition. The length of the course will be a maximum of 800 m. Not to exceed 20 obstacles. Speeds and clearances will be in accordance with the 2024 ADS Rule Book. There may be a bridge on course for Preliminary and Intermediate Divisions. Training is NOT allowed to Canter. Cones course will use standardized wheel settings.

#### **DERBY**

The course consists of:

- a. common Start/Finish markers
- b. a minimum of two and a maximum of four marathon-type obstacles with up to five compulsory gates each
- c. 6-16 cones-type compulsory gates.

Gloves are recommended. Drivers are required to carry a whip in hand at all times while on the derby course. Competitors and Grooms must wear securely fastened Protective Headgear and Protective Vests during the Derby.

There may be a water obstacle with a dry route option for Training. Use of **breeching is mandatory** for singles and vehicles that have no brakes.

Training Level will complete 3 gates (A, B & C), and are permitted to walk/trot anywhere on course. Obstacles will be timed with times posted. Training level competitors are **NOT** permitted to canter on the course or within the obstacles.

Preliminary Level will complete 4 gates (A, B, C & D), and Intermediate Level will complete 5 gates (A, B, C, D & E) within each obstacle. Obstacles will be timed with times posted.

#### **SHOW OFFICE TIMES**

The Show Office opens Friday evening from 3:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. and Saturday from 8:30 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. Sunday from 8:30 am to 9:30 am. Competitors and Grooms must report to the show office upon arrival to pick up their Competitor's Package and to sign the required waivers.
